English:

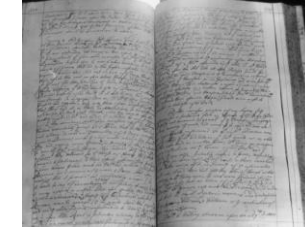
Read some more books about The Great Fire of London.
