Parking and Consideration

As you all know, we regularly ask, both within the school newsletter and within other school communications, that parents park considerably in the village when dropping off and picking up your children. We ask that cars are not parked illegally: on double-yellow lines, adjacent to junctions or blocking residents' homes access. We also ask that children are not 'dropped off' at the bottom of the hill as this can cause both traffic and safety issues as the school hill is a road with quite a few vehicles using it and needing access. We have staggered times for the end of the day to try and support the traffic flow through the village as much as possible, therefore we ask that once you have picked up your child, you leave so as to make space for other parents who are coming at a later time. Parking—in all honesty—is a nightmare at so many schools in both rural and urban settings—there really is no easy answer other than being considerate and respectful to the residents of the village and each other.

Children and Car Seat Safety

We have had reports of cars driving away from school at the end of the school day with young children being seen not securely strapped into the car. Please remind whoever picks up your children that they need to be secure in the car before driving off.

Walk to School Week

The next Walk to School Week will be week commencing 22nd June. Cards will be sent home with children towards the end of next week. There is information on the card but the general idea is that children walk more than they travel in a car, even if it just means parking a little further away and walking to and from school from there. All completed cards must be returned to school, with as many days completed as possible (they do not all have to complete every day) and your child will collect a prize from their teacher when they hand the card in. Every card handed in will earn a prize. Please could all cards be returned on Friday 26th or Monday 29th June. For Nursery just return the card next time they are in.

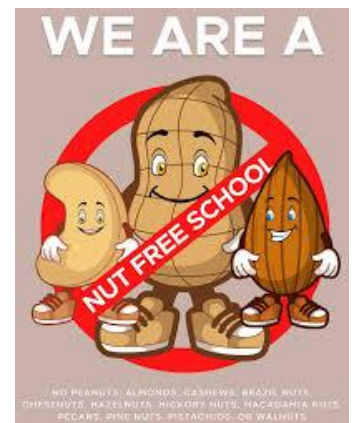

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
