Toys, Jewellery, Make-up and Nail Varnish in school:

Recently there has been a growing amount of toys being brought into school. Unless there is a specific reason for the toy, which has been agreed by the class teacher, all toys must be kept at home. This includes 'bag clips and charms'. There has also been an increase in jewellery—children can wear a small stud ear-ring if they have their ears pierced and they can take them out independently for PE. Otherwise jewellery is not part of our school uniform so please keep it at home too. Some pupils are wearing make-up for school. This is not part of the uniform either—Mrs. TB has wipes in her room if make-up needs removing but please do not let your child come to school wearing make-up or nail varnish. Thank you for your support with this.

Absence Reporting – Only on the day absences

Please report all illness/medical absences via the Arbor App – this cannot be used for requesting permission for other absences.

Dear Parents and Carers

Parking Around School – Keeping Our Children and Village Safe

I am writing following a significant increase in complaints from local residents and fellow parents regarding parking and driving during the school drop-off and collection times.

Hayton is a beautiful village with a particularly **narrow main road**, and the volume of traffic at the beginning and end of the school day means that **everyone must play their part in keeping our children, families, residents and other road users safe**.

Unfortunately, a number of vehicles have recently been observed parking or stopping illegally and dangerously, causing obstruction, reducing visibility and creating unnecessary risks for pedestrians—particularly our children.

Please remember:



- **Double yellow lines** mean **no waiting at any time**. You must not park on double yellow lines, regardless of the time of day, unless a specific exemption applies.

- **Single yellow lines** are subject to time restrictions. Parking is only permitted when the restrictions displayed on nearby signs allow it. Parking during restricted times is an offence. ****PLEASE**

NOTE – the Single Yellow Lines in Hayton have parking restrictions which mean you CAN NOT parking on them in between 8am and 4pm**



- The **Highway Code** states that drivers **must not park within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction**, as this seriously restricts visibility for motorists and pedestrians.
- Please do not block driveways, dropped kerbs, pavements or access routes.

School Hill

We have received several complaints regarding vehicles **stopping at the bottom of the school hill and on the corner leading onto the hill** to drop off or collect children.



This is particularly dangerous because:

- visibility for approaching traffic is significantly reduced;
- children can unexpectedly step into the road from between parked vehicles;
- vehicles travelling up and down the hill have limited opportunity to react safely;
- traffic quickly becomes blocked on what is already a narrow road, creating further risks for emergency vehicles, residents and other road users.

Despite our additional efforts of placing cones at the bottom of the school hill, some parents continue to parking in front of them, with no regard or recognition of them being placed there for the safety of our children.

For the safety of everyone, **please do not stop, park or drop children off** in these locations.

One-Way System

We also ask all parents and carers to continue supporting the **voluntary one-way system** through the village during drop-off and collection times. This system was introduced to improve traffic flow and reduce congestion on our narrow village roads. It can only be effective if everyone follows it, and I would ask all families to do so out of courtesy for one another and for our local residents.

Police Involvement

The school has no legal powers to enforce parking regulations. However, due to the number of complaints received, I have now contacted the police again to discuss the ongoing concerns and all future complaints received by the school will be forwarded to the police for their information and consideration.

If you witness parking that is illegal or poses a danger to others, this should be reported directly to the police by calling **101** (or **999** if there is an immediate risk to life or a serious emergency). This enables the appropriate authorities to investigate and take enforcement action where necessary.



I appreciate that parking around school can be challenging, and I would like to thank the many parents and carers who already park responsibly, show consideration for our neighbours and help keep our children safe.

By working together, we can ensure that Hayton continues to be a safe, welcoming village and that our school remains a positive part of our local community.

If you rely on people to pick up and drop off your children who will not receive this information, please make sure you pass this onto them.

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

No

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

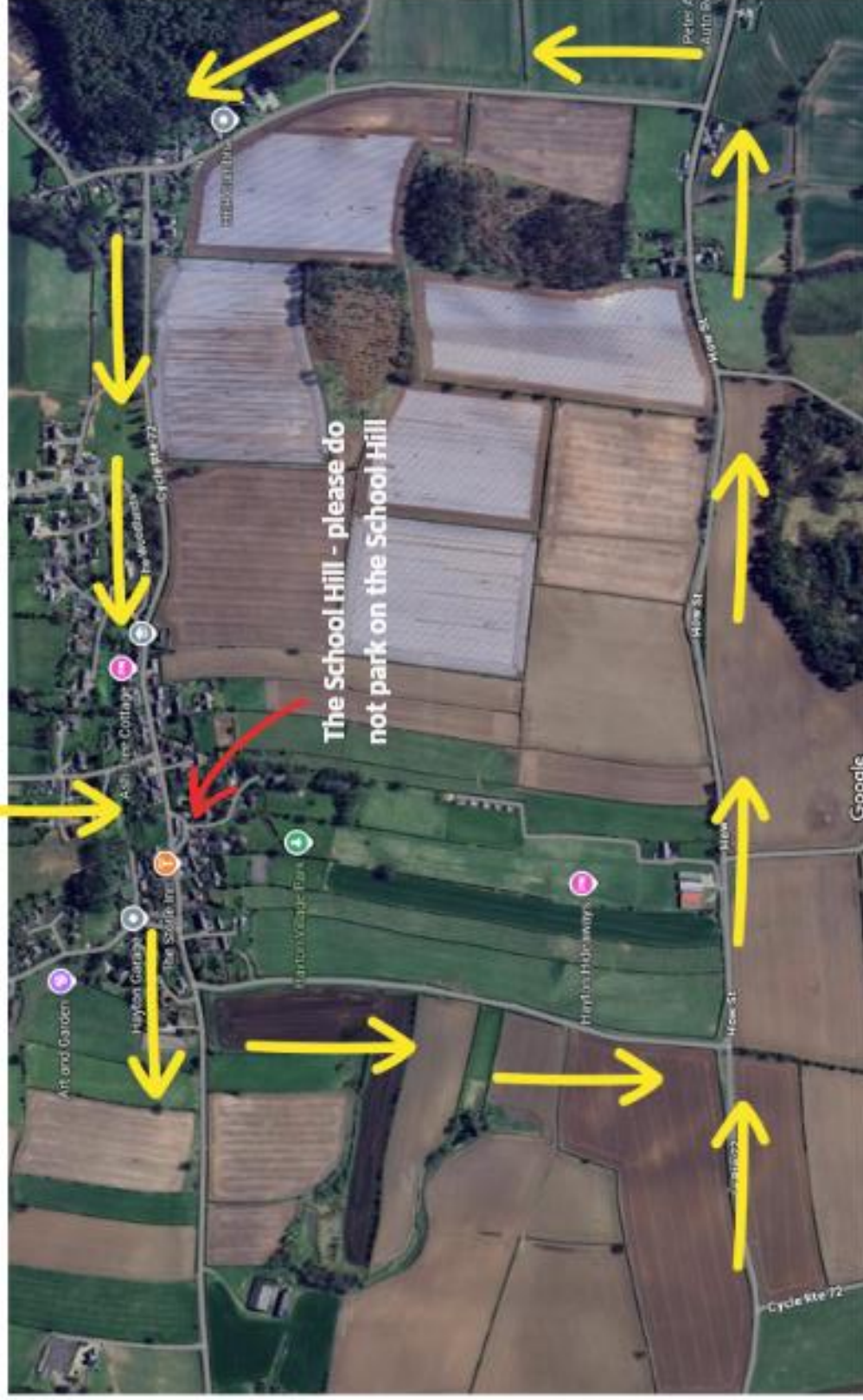
