

Track and Trace during the Holidays

Once the half term holidays start, schools are still required to support the NHS and the authorities with track and trace. It is important that parents are clear about the procedure should a student test positive in the holidays.

If a student tests positive and symptoms begin up to and including Sunday 30th May, school must be notified in order to support with contact tracing by emailing Mrs Gosson-Low (cgosson-low@hayton.cumbria.sch.uk) who will be monitoring emails from now until Tuesday 1st June. If there is a positive case in this time period, and your child's bubble is affected, you will be informed by email.

If symptoms begin any time from Monday 31st May onwards, families are asked to follow the instructions given by NHS track and trace and the school does not need to be contacted over the holiday period. Please inform school of any self-isolation required on the first day of the new term.
