Communication and Language

Animal noises, sing old Mcdonald had a farm and fill your farm with as many animals as you can. Could you have a penguin on your farm? What would it sound like? Ask a grown up to help you find out and try to imitate it. What other animals could you sound like?

<u>Literacy</u>

Can you practise writing your favourite animals names?
Maybe you could draw and name your pet? Draw animals and name them, adults can help support handwriting.

<u>Maths</u>

Sorting and matching. Can you sort different objects around your house? You could put a mix of pastas into a bowl and sort them then play tea parties. Maybe you could sort buttons into sets or sorting cutlery into the right places in the drawer. You could also practise laying the table which helps your understanding of grouping and sets.

Please help your child to read and spell these words over the term. They will also come home weekly in a handwriting homework book. I will assess them at the end of the half term.

Can you make rubbings using wax crayons? Discuss how your rubbings look, what different textures can you find? Use words like hard, soft, bumpy and smooth to describe the textures.

Understanding the World

Animal facts. Can you choose an animal you love and find out as much about them as you can? You could look at TV shows, the internet (with a grown up) or animal nonfiction books. Brampton Library has some super non-fiction books. Why not go and see.

Personal. Social and Emotional Development

Look at yourself in a mirror and make different faces to show feelings. Happy, sad, angry or excited. What other feelings can you show. Talk about how your face changes when you show a feeling. Maybe a grown up can photograph you with your feelings face and pop it onto Tapestry for us!
