School Lunches—Important Update

We are changing our school meal provider to **Orian** after Half Term, with effect from Monday 30th October 2023. To activate your Orian account, go to **www.schoolhub.co.uk**, log in with your email address (this should be the one you were previously using for your Dolce account) and then click 'forgotten password'. Once you have received your new password, you will be able to log in to your account and start ordering meals (please be aware that both main courses and puddings will need to be selected and you will only be able to prebook your meals up to 2 weeks in advance). Meals must be ordered by 9.30am on the day they are required.

It is important to note that it is parents' responsibility to check that the allergy/ intolerance information stated on their child's record is correct and to check the ingredients in the meals they are ordering. If you notice that any allergy/ intolerance information is incorrect or missing from your child's record, please contact the school office.

This week's 'BIG' question, linked to current events, is : "How does change happen?" The children were introduced, very briefly, to Olive Morris—and we will be talking about her more next week as well as other significant women of colour and how they have instigated change.

Mary Magdalene (She was one of the women who travelled with Jesus. She witnessed many of Jesus' miracles, stood at the foot of Jesus' cross, and was present as he died and was buried. She was also one of the first witnesses of Jesus' Resurrection.)
