Walby school trip	Some councillors were concerned about the safety of the visit because of the slides. This was held over.
Hotdogs and crisps for dinner	It was decided to see how the current new school lunch menu goes before asking for any changes.
Teddy day	It was decided that this is a good idea, especially for the younger children.
More non uniform days	It was decided that we have enough non-uniform days and that sometimes some people don't like non-uniform day – uniform means 'all the same' and that's what we are at Hayton.
