Science	Uses of Everyday Materials - identify and compare the uses of a variety of everyday materials including wood, plastic, metal, glass, brick/rock, and paper/cardboard. Find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching
Computing	Presentation Skills - revise computer skills needed for safe and effective computer use and introduce some further skills concerning the use of folders, searching for files and printing. Introduce children to presentations and teach the skills needed to create a simple presentation.
RE	Rules and Routines – why we have rules and routines and how they help us in our everyday lives – Christianity, Judaism, Islam and Sikhism
PE	Athletics and ball skills (Mr Smith)
Geography	Magical Mapping – explore a range of maps at a local, national and global level, developing their understanding of how to navigate around an atlas to find countries, continents, oceans and seas.
Art	Create a collage of The Gingerbread Man using different materials and colour mixing. Painting and drawing.
Design Technology	Create a 3D model of a house that will not blow down Make a boat for the gingerbread man to cross the river safely Moving Pictures

Reading – Daily

Literacy – Tuesday (please hand in by following Monday)

Numeracy – Thursday (please hand in by following Wednesday)

Spellings will only be tested at the end of every half term. Children will have spellings lessons daily for 20 – 30 minutes in school where they will complete activities to learn new year 2 spelling patterns and consolidate patterns learned in year 1. A list will be sent home in due course with a list of spellings being learned during the current half term together with suggestions for activities to be used for practise at home.

Please listen to your child read as often as possible (preferably daily) and write a comment in their reading record in their blue diary. We cannot emphasise enough the importance of daily reading and questioning your children about what has happened in the story. Children who are reading both colour coded books and quiz books (blue sticker on spine with a number e.g. 2.3) should read their colour book one night and quiz book the next. Quiz books will be given out after they have taken the star reading test and their new reading range known.

Numeracy passports. Please note that passports should be signed off at home in the first two columns and teachers sign the third column in school. Children need to answer mathematical facts quickly to complete their passports. This is an important requirement to ensure that children are able to progress into other areas of maths with confidence.

In Autumn 2 we will have swimming lessons every Thursday morning from 31st October to 5th December.
